5. Meeting open to the public for discussion of agenda items.

- Public member #1 – questioned the following: Curriculum, page 5, items 11 and 12: why are we utilizing two separate accounts to pay these items?
- Curriculum, page 5, item #14: \$8,000 appears to be high as it appears that this is costing the district \$2,000 per day. What is this for?
- Curriculum, page 6, item #17: if the district is revising curriculum now, why are we doing this since the year is almost over.
- Curriculum, page 9, item #32: how will the 80 students participating in this program be selected, and what is the AVID Program?
- Old and New Business, page 21: the policies that you have listed are not on the website, so how does the public know what you are planning to do and what changes are being made.
- Dr. Rodriguez stated the following: regarding items 11 and 12: they are not the same training. One is training for the middle schools; one is training for elementary schools. They look like the same, but they are not.
- Regarding item #14: Dr. Milou will be presenting this professional development for our staff. It will be specific training for teachers that will take place during the summer. Dr. Milou is present this evening and will discuss this during his presentation tonight.
- Regarding item #17: the writing of curriculum has been a massive undertaking. We've been able to complete a lot since last year, but there are some areas that have not been completed and we need to do them before the year is over. This should have been part of the effort to be in compliance with QSAC. It should've been done earlier but we couldn't do it due to the volume. Throughout the year we've been approving many others and we have use the older curriculum until these are completed. Curriculum was not revised under the last administration. QSAC found us to be delinquent in this area, so we began this massive undertaking and we hope to get it all done for September, but we cannot be sure.
- Regarding item #32: the 80 students is an estimate. This is a summer program offered to those students who have been targeted for language arts to promote literacy development. Mr. Heidelberg, Shull School Principal, stated that they are looking at the reading level scores. Some kids also can use an extra push over the summer. We looked at the honors kids to look for a program for them as well. This is a three tier model used for instruction. We take it where they are now and provide additional help and then help them to move ahead.
- Regarding item #35: the AVID Program is to promote college and career readiness. This year we have a pilot program in the 6th grade. Teachers will be trained and get a stipend for teaching and working with this. We visited Edison to review the program and the data on this program. Our staff that visited Edison and viewed this program, liked it. The public member stated that she always thought that the goal was to get kids college ready, so this seems redundant. Our kids should be ready when they graduate.

- Public member #2 – questioned the following: Curriculum, page 9, item #34. Extended school year for disabled students. Why is this for those that are disabled? What kinds of disabilities are we talking about?
- Finance, page 13, item #13: the cost appears high for this program.
- Finance, page 13, item #1: specifically the training/professional development for Dr. Rodriguez. Why is the cost so high?
- Dr. Rodriguez stated the following: regarding Finance item #1: this is an annual conference for the Superintendent that is held by the New Jersey Association of School Administrators and it's contractual for her.
- Mr. Jess stated the following: regarding item #13: this cost is for the entire preschool program; teachers, supplies, benefits, everything contained within the preschool program is included. This item always has to be approved separately as it has been done in the past.
- Public member #3 – questioned the following: Curriculum, page 8, item #25: is this for administration, students or teachers? There is bullying amongst kids, but also among the staff from the top down. Mr. Heidelberg stated that they are all connected programs. The bullying program is part of the seven ways to achieve greatness. The teachers train the entire classroom and run through some scenarios to work with the students so they know how to deal with these issues.
- If was asked if this program will also go to the McGinnis School, High School and any other school?
- Dr. Rodriguez stated that we will have the SCIP Committee in each building look into this. There are lots of ways for staff to reach out to us if they feel bullied so we can work in tandem with them. There are lots of vehicles for the staff to use to speak to us.
- Finance, page 12, item #7: what is this? Mr. Jess stated that this is a male dance troupe that will work with our Performing Arts Academy to help them understand dance and to learn more about dance.
- Public member #4 – questioned the following: Finance, page 12, item #12: he's happy that the school is being built. Congratulations to whoever was in charge of getting this done. Mr. Jess said thank you and stated that the school is expected to open in September 2018.
- Public member #5 - spoke about Curriculum, page 10, item #38: the YMCA swim program. There are classified students who recently participated in the swim program. These are non-attentive and non-social students. Mr. Cilia noticed that when these students were participating in the swim program, they became communicative, enjoyed it and the staff was able to connect with these students. The Flynn Child Study Team will set benchmarks and begin this pilot program to work with these students to see what the benefits are to the kids.
- Regarding Curriculum item 43, on the addendum: the YMCA will submit the 21st Century Community Learning Centers Program Grant to the federal government to target the program and bring it back to the district. There are three areas that they will target: Willow Pond/waterfront area, teen nights and working in tandem to design the new high school.
- Public member #6 – questioned the following: Personnel, page 17, item #4c: the hourly rate for the bus driver salary appears high. Is that rate based on an existing rate or is it set by the person exiting the position? Mr. Jess stated that it is the contractual rate as the bus drivers are in the union.

Statement by Mr. Lebreault, Board President:

The Perth Amboy School District has been informed about some concerns pertaining to discipline issues at the McGinnis School recently. The District takes these types of allegations seriously and is conducting an internal investigation to ascertain the facts. The District expects its staff to adhere to policies and procedures relating to student discipline. What we know for sure now is that the conduct did not involve any type of physical assault on students. As a strictly precautionary measure, members of the administration and the teaching staff have been placed on administrative leave to allow an investigation to occur. Appropriate administrative and teaching staff have been reassigned to the McGinnis School to ensure the continuity of instruction.

The Board cannot make further comments at this time about McGinnis School because there is an ongoing investigation involving staff and students. We appreciate your understanding that student and staff privacy rights must be respected.

We continue to assure the public, parents, and the school community as a whole that student safety is the District's utmost concern, and the District will take all steps necessary to protect students.

We need to do our due diligence because it's unrealistic that the school will be built there by 2018.
- Mr. Lebreault asked Mr. Jess to explain why we're approving this item tonight and what the impact is.
- Mr. Jess stated that all this item is the approval of the new school's education specifications and the schematic design so that it can be sent to the Department of Education because the school cannot be built without Department of Education approval. The SDA is the funding mechanism, but the Department of Education is the approving mechanism. Once the DOE approves the project, the SDA can move forward and continue to work on the plans to get the project completed and ready for construction. Mr. Jess also stated that the emergency management leaders in the city will be meeting with the SDA to discuss area traffic and emergency procedures for the facility. A traffic study will also be done.
- Ms. Tejeda asked what can we do with regards to Harbor Town.
- Mr. Jess stated that he will look into it to see what information he can find, but he has not heard of that before.
- Mr. Varela stated that Mr. Puccio is correct, but that they have changed plans a number of times, so if you look back and see what's happened and where it is now, it may be totally different. It's a hardship on our schools created by the building all these apartments.

17. Open to the Public

- Public member #1 - stated that she hears Board members whispering more than she hears the main speaker. Please look into that. With regards to the February meeting, students voiced their opinion about not being heard and she was glad to see it. We always hear the term 'moving forward' but we don't see anything happening. She feels that we are proceeding down 'deficiency lane'. She also asked why she continues to get phone calls for detention at Perth Amboy High School when she doesn't go there anymore. She had surgery because the school couldn't accommodate her. She didn't get home instruction until March 21st. She had to fight for it because it was left on someone's desk. On June 26, 2014 she asked for an investigation and every time she's spoken to Dr. Rodriguez, she was told 'in two weeks, in two weeks'. It's been a year and she wants the results done right away or else something funny is going on.
- Public member #2 - stated under Old and New Business the Board approved the second reading of policies, what does that mean? With regards to curriculum, she's heard that the curriculum wasn't updated because people before 'us' didn't do it; but the person we have in charge of curriculum has been here for ten years. Why wasn't it done before? It should have been and now it's a waste of tax payer's money because it wasn't done. People are functionally illiterate. When we ask questions, sometimes they are not answered. Why is that? All questions should be answered. It's unacceptable that the curriculum is not done on a timely basis. Classes are being taught with textbooks that are 15 years old.
- Public member #3 - stated (1) that the make-up days at McGinnis School should no longer be on Saturday and the vote to state what specific days will be used as make-up days was supposed to take place tonight, but hasn't. Why? (2) There is a snow day that needs to be given back to the staff. What day will be used for this day? (3) The labor contract was approved by the AFT, but it wasn't approved by the Board tonight. Why? A Special Meeting should be called to approve the agreement.
- Public member #4 - stated with regards to Personnel, page 15, items #14h & 14i, that he would be remiss if he didn't speak about these two people. He first met Donna Pittel when he went to the Wilentz School and asked Mr. Jenkins who the Educational Leader was. Mr. Jenkins told him that he was only there for three days, but if he waited three weeks, he'd see who the Educational Leader was. He waited and saw that it was Donna Pittel, who used her strength in her teaching. She gave great advice and made him a better principal and a better person. We'll get a replacement for her, but the length in teaching profession doesn't lead to perfection, working on your craft does. She was a Michael Angelo and she painted a picture with every child. She's marvelous and unwavering in her dedication to the kids. He can't say enough about how she helped him, the kids and the staff and he would be remiss without acknowledging her and the work she's done here for over thirty years.

17. Open to the Public (continued)

- Public member #5 - stated he's here about the McGinnis School incident. He has a daughter at the school. While he appreciates how the Board has handled it, he is concerned. The way I raised my child is not to be disciplined in that manner. He's concerned that more parents were not here tonight to express their concerns. Who gave the principal the authority to do this? If it happened once, it can happen again. His job is to discipline his children. He appreciates that the school teaches and encourages the kids, but change needs to happen and it needs to be done effectively.
- Public member #6 - stated with regards to Seaman Avenue, that as a taxpayer, we know you weren't involved in the acquisition of the property. Remediation is an investment of our tax money, but will that investment be worth it or should we get rid of that asset. Give credit to anyone that expresses concern. It does not lessen the extent of concern on matters that are very delicate. We have a Code of Conduct Policy and a duty to safe-guard our kids. Whatever actions that will be taken, do it swiftly and make it comprehensive.
- Public member #7 - stated that it saddens her and does not surprise her to be here to talk about the past election. A Superior Court Judge said that Lesley Dominguez-Rodriguez and Gilfrank Nunez fraudulently obtained votes for her husband, his running mates and the council. Those people should not be taken advantage of who were in the nursing home. It's hard to believe that the Board did not read about it. No one expressed their displeasure except for Mr. Ortiz and it bothers her that this is the image that was sent to the students. If a kid cheats on a test, they fail. If an athlete cheats, they are removed from the team. But if a Board member cheats, it's okay. No one sent a letter to the prosecutor because they were scared of their own election and they don't want to raise questions about it. The speaker asked, that in keeping with standards for our students, for the immediate resignation of Ms. Tejeda, Mr. Rodriguez and Mr. Nunez and that of employee Gilfrank Nunez as well. By not acting on this it sends a bad message to our students. I hope you do the right thing.
- Public member #8 - stated she's saddened by the McGinnis School incident and recent community events. We hope to deal with this quickly. There are bullying strategies from the top down. When her son was at McGinnis School, he was bullied. We look at transfers and why staff members are requesting a transfer. Use common sense and ask these people why they want to leave because they leave for a reason. Morale is not good and hasn't been good for a while. It's tense. It's about our kids. She also asked where we are with the pest problem that we spoke about some meetings ago.
- Public member #9 - spoke about the McGinnis School and that it's a sad day. She believes that before there is any litigation, you should take the time and talk to the kids so that you can hear both sides of the story about what happened. We can't afford any more lawsuits.

Perth Amboy Mathematics Curriculum & Instruction Review

Dr. Eric Milou
Professor of Mathematics
Rowan University

Who Am I?

- Dr. Eric Milou is a professor of mathematics at Rowan University in Glassboro, NJ. Dr. Milou has taught at Rowan for the past 18 years.
- Served six terms as the President of the Rowan University Senate from 2007 to 2013.
- Served as President as the Association of Mathematics Teachers of New Jersey (2005), the program chairperson of the NCTM annual meeting (2007) and has extensive speaking experience on standards based reform in mathematics.
- The recipient of the Max Sobel Outstanding Mathematics Educator Award in 2009.

Curriculum Review

- The documents are voluminous, well written, and aligned with the Common Core State Standards for mathematics. The district should be commended for these efforts,

Curriculum Recommendations

- To facilitate use by teachers, curriculum resources should be placed on the web organized by standard and teachers should be trained on how to use and access such resources.
- The curriculum documents lack detailed examples of formative assessment. This should be a major area of emphasis moving forward.
- Pacing guides should be revised to match the sequence of content covered on the PARCC PBA (by the end of February).
- The benchmark assessments are excellent but should be placed in a digital environment so that students can have a similar experience to the PARCC assessment.

Instruction Review (K-4)

- I visited all 5 elementary schools and observed 20 teachers.
- The majority of classroom instruction is lecture based with teacher talk dominating class time. There are a few notable exceptions who use student centered pedagogy.
 - DeLosSantos (Ceres-Grade 2)
 - Panilla (Wilentz-Grade 2)
 - Maskowitz (Flynn-Grade 4)
 - Klosek (Patten-Grade 2)

Instruction Continued (K-4)

- Formative assessment techniques and exit slips are not in use in the overwhelming majority of classrooms. This must be a huge component of the district's improvement plan.
- Differentiation is present in very few classrooms. Most teachers have all students working on the same problem at the same time.
 - In one particular grade one classroom, the teachers exclaimed to a student: "I didn't say you could do the bottom. Don't do the bottom (referring to the bottom of the worksheet)".
 - We have to create a culture where students can be supported and other students can be challenged simultaneously in all classrooms.
 - In other class (grade 1), a student completed all his math problems correctly and was directed to read a book.

Middle School: McGinnis

- Lack of consistent instructional vision is especially prevalent
- TTO becomes the curriculum in grades 6-8
- Diagnostic assessments control the learning path of each child (what if the computer based assessment is not valid or the child does not take it seriously)
- Not all children receive grade level instruction daily
- Overwhelmingly skilled based lessons
- Lack of rigor (skill, concept, and application/modeling)

Middle School: Shull

- Progressive Mathematics Initiative (PMI) developed by the NJ Center for Teaching and Learning is the main instructional material.
- There is some vision for instruction centered around PMI, formative assessment, and several drill/skill websites.
- Formative assessment was prevalent in the classrooms but the data was often not used to remediate and no enrichment was present.
- Very few learning styles/modalities were incorporated as most lessons involved students in whole group for the entire lesson.

Next Steps

1. Revise the district's curriculum planning guides for grades 3-5 to align with PARCC PBA/EOY assessments
2. Provide professional development for grades 3-5 teachers creating a mathematics instruction vision including formative assessment, student centered pedagogy and differentiation.
3. Support vision by building curriculum resources including lessons (in digital format) and assessments to improve mathematics instruction for grades 3-5 including the creation of a website of resources and lessons.
4. Conduct in-classroom (grades 3-8) model mathematics lessons.

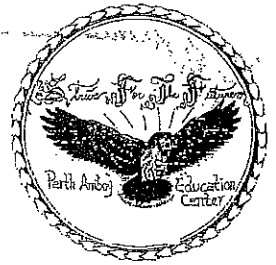
Next Steps continued

5. Provide pull out PD workshops for grades 3-4 and instructional leaders to enhance vision and continue to build curriculum resources and formative assessments.
6. Investigate the cost of hiring at least 3 FT or PT math coaches
7. Middle Schools
 - Create district committee (2015-16) to review and select curriculum materials for grades 6-8 to be implemented in fall 2016 at both middle schools.
 - Develop a middle school mathematics instructional vision.
 - Create district planning guides for grades 5-8 mathematics to align with common core math standards; provide professional development on vision and exemplary mathematics lessons

Personalized Learning Program

Mission

To provide 9th grade students that have not earned more than 15 credits, specifically in Math and/or Language Arts, the opportunity to recover unearned credits and increase their academic skills while earning credits towards their Perth Amboy High School Diploma.

Goal

The goal of the Personalized Learning Program (PLP) is to have students progressively develop their academic skills while working towards their Perth Amboy High School diploma in the Personalized Learning Program. This program enrolls the student in the appropriate classes the student was originally unsuccessful in while also receiving additional intervention support in math and language arts. The intervention part of the program is to help students increase their academic skills. After one year in the program, the student will have the opportunity to remain in the Personalized Learning Program (PLP) that includes the advisory and internship component (Based on the Big Picture Program) or return to the main campus.

PLP Enrollment

Students will be enrolled in this program at the beginning of the school year in September. The students will be identified by their academic record in Math and/or Language Arts and number of credits earned. For the 2015-2016 school year, an initial enrollment of 80 students can be accommodated.

Flexible Schedule

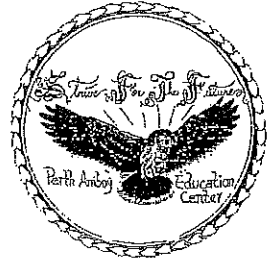

The Little Doctors

The Little Doctors program got its start in 1996 when sixth-grade teacher Karen Brothers worked with her students to organize a blood drive. At a blood drive, people volunteer to donate their blood so it can be given to someone who needs it. At the first drive, student volunteers recruited more than 140 donors and the Little Doctors program was born.

Andrea Cefarelli works at New York Blood Center and helps organize the Little Doctors. She sat down with TFK to talk about the program and volunteers. "The kids were just amazing," she told TFK. "They asked their parents, neighbors and teachers to give blood."

Jessica Mascolino ran her first blood drive when she was in third grade. With Jessica's help, more than 1,800 pints of healthy blood have been collected. Today, more than 300 schools in New York and New Jersey participate. Cefarelli, Jessica and others at the New York Blood Center are working to take the program to other states. "It's important to know that giving blood can save someone's life," Jessica, who is now 18, told TFK.

Summary: Children with special needs can benefit from activities outside the classroom such as swimming. Involvement in non-academic activities can enhance the school experience for these children. The expectation of this program is that it will support the children's growth academically, socially and physically. Swim programs for children with special needs have the following benefits.

- 1) Speech
 - a. Increase in verbal responses
 - b. Improved oral-motor skills
 - c. Increase in language
- 2) Sensory
 - a. The hydrostatic pressure can provide soothing sensory input to the child.


Letter of Agreement Between Perth Amboy High School and 10 Hairy Legs

Augmentative and Alternative Communication and Assistive Technology

CPNJ's ATLAS Division specializes in Assistive and Educational Technology and Augmentative and Alternative Communication. We offer an array of assessment and training services.

The ATLAS Team includes Occupational Therapists, Speech and Language Pathologists and Assistive Technology Practitioners with a combined experience of over 50 years.

ATLAS services focuses on supporting individuals with disabilities in achieving communication, educational, vocational and lifestyle goals, as well as supporting the family, peers and professionals surrounding those individuals. **Assistive Technology (AT)** services from CPNJ consider and explore tools to address computer access, educational participation, mobile touch technology and some integrated aspects of mobility and daily living skills. AT can also include Educational Technology (ET), which includes specialized software and hardware designed to support learning across academic subjects and standards. **Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC)** services address ways of supporting individuals with complex communication needs in their ability to express themselves using supplemental tools.

Fees through June 2015:

Assessment \$750

ATLAS team members assess an individual's goals, skills, environment(s) and preferences when considering tools, equipment, strategies and techniques for an Assistive Technology or Augmentative and Alternative Communication system.

Combined Assessment \$1200

For assessments that address both Assistive Technology and Augmentative and Alternative Communication, more than one practitioner may be warranted to make suggestions for an integrated system of related components and strategies. Combined assessments are also typical for individuals with complex access and/or seating needs.

Consultation \$400

ATLAS team members can offer suggestions for integrating and maintaining an individual's existing AAC/AT system, maximizing its use throughout the environment and supporting beneficial outcomes for the individual.

Training \$150/hour

As a follow-up to assessment services, ATLAS team members can provide technical and clinical training on topics including hardware, software, system creation and implementation techniques. Training sessions can target users, families, support staff and other professionals.

Minimum of two hours per session

Tailored Services Call for Rates

The ATLAS team is able to customize educational, therapeutic and administrative services surrounding AT, ET and AAC. Example include: creating accessible curricular and functional activities; maximizing your existing AT inventory; managing your technology resources effectively; expanding your tools and equipment to accommodate a wider range of users; and other collaborative services to target AT and AAC supports.

Professional Development Call for Rates

ATLAS team members are available to host and provide on- and off-site family workshops and professional development events on various AAC and AT topics. Rates may vary due to travel time, the length and scope of the presentation, and the number of participants.

Following a request for services, CPNJ requires a funding voucher or letter of intent from the supporting school district or other funding source, securing payment for services. Upon receipt of funding approval, the individual's caregivers will receive an intake packet, which includes a Consent for Services form, a Release of Information form, and an AAC/AT survey. The supporting team will also receive an AAC/AT questionnaire. A CPNJ team member will call to schedule an appointment in the individual's natural environment, typically within four weeks of receiving the completed packet. Upon completion of services, a written report that may include suggestions for equipment, strategies and training is generated and mailed to the funding source.
