5. Meeting open to the public for discussion of agenda items.

- Public member #1 - asked the following questions: regarding curriculum item 12-A-3: QSAC letter: why isn't the most recent QSAC Report posted on the website? We dropped from 62% to 32% in Program and Instruction and have had no improvement since.
- Regarding curriculum item #14-A-11: how were these students selected? How many hours are they working and what will they be doing?
- Regarding curriculum item #14-A-38: why is there a SCIP committee for the high school with no one representing Special Education?
- Regarding curriculum item #14-A-50: what is Atomic Learning?
- Regarding curriculum item #14-A-54: will someone be monitoring the teachers who participate in the high school learning center?
- Regarding buildings and grounds item #14-C-6: what needs to be removed from the Seaman Avenue property?
- Regarding personnel item #14-D-39: why isn't the new superintendent listed under administrative appointments for next year, why are there no administrative salaries listed and why is an administrator that's been out on leave coming back?
- Regarding personnel item #14-D-45: what is the Public Agency Compliance Officer?
- Dr. Rodriguez stated that with regards to QSAC that the curriculum must be written and revised every five years. Under the former Superintendent it didn't get done. Curriculum was given to the teachers to write during their PLC time and it didn't get done. We're still at 32% because it took a long time to write these. We're still in the process of revising the curriculum for physical education and health and it will continue into the summer. The 2013 QSAC report is still on the website because it's the original report from our last monitoring.
- Mr. Jess spoke about the second question and stated that these students were selected by the guidance staff to share their college experiences with our existing students, to help our existing students write their college essays, to help them complete their financial aid forms and to help motivate our kids to show them what is possible if you work and you study.
- With regards to item #14-C-6 for Seaman Avenue, Mr. Jess stated that this is the firm that is going to be hired to remove the contaminated soil from the Seaman Avenue property so that the SDA can build our school. The SDA has stated that they will not remove any of the soil because they do not own the land so the district has to do it.

5. Meeting open to the public for discussion of agenda items. (continued)

- Regarding Personnel item #14-D-45 - Public Compliant Agency Officer, Mr. Jess stated that this person makes sure that our contracts comply with the policies of the State and promotes equal employment opportunity and affirmative action within all of our public contracts. There is no extra compensation for this 'title'. The reason that we're doing it now is because it's supposed to be done every year at the re-organization meeting, however it wasn't done at that time.
- Regarding item #14-A-54 - the high school learning center, Dr. Rodriguez stated that she believes an Instructional Leader has been hired to supervise the teachers and staff in the Learning Center.
- Regarding the SCIP Committee, Dr. Rodriguez stated that she believes that the high school principal is the person who selects the members for the committee and it's up to his discretion. She will discuss it with Dr. Collazo and find out why no one from Special Education was included.
- Public member #2 - asked about QSAC and why Program and Instruction isn't taken seriously. With regard to the principal that's returning; with all the controversy that's surrounding her, why is she returning and when will she return. Was an investigation done regarding this incident?
- Mr. Lebreault said that we can't speak about this person because it's a personnel issue, but there was an investigation.
- Public member #3 - asked about item #12-A-3 QSAC. Why did you only address one section? Isn't Personnel the only section that you earned 100% in? Has it stayed the same or did the score drop? You either pass or fail, so why aren't the other four areas being addressed?
- Regarding item #14-D-1, there are two resignations under H and I - Debra Sheard and Charlie Wolff. When you post these positions you need to have transparency in the selection process because the last time you posted these positions there was none. Dr. Sheard interviewed before the position was posted and the application was received after the posting was closed, as reported by Dr. Rodriguez.
- Mrs. Gutierrez stated there was nothing illegal about the posting or the interview process.
- Regarding items #14-D-47 & 48, when will Dr. Roman's hiring and contract be made public?
- Mr. Lebreault stated that the QSAC the scores we received are as follows: 100% in personnel, 32% in program and instruction, 62% in governance, 98% in finance and 90% in operations.
- Public member #4 - spoke about item #14-D-1N, Frank Kilane. He thanked Mr. Kilane for all his years of service to the Wilentz School. Mr. Kilane made sure that all the kids and staff were always safe; that visitors always followed the proper procedures and signed in and followed the rules. He also thanked Mr. Wolff for all the changes he made which helped all of us to be better.
- Public member #5 - asked about item #14-C-7 - McGinnis School site work, what is this for?
- Regarding QSAC, is there a presentation with the results. Just tell everybody how it works. With regards to Personnel item #14-D-45, is someone getting paid more for this?
- Mr. Lebreault stated that we will provide a link for the QSAC report so everyone can view it.
- Mr. Jess stated that the site work is for the McGinnis School to replace the existing wall and fence, install a new electronic sign, repave all the black top around the building and install new drainage.
- With regards to Personnel item #14-D-45 the Public Compliant Agency Officer makes sure that our contracts comply with the policies of the State and promotes equal employment opportunity and affirmative action within all of our public contracts. There is no extra compensation for this.
- Public member #6 - wanted to know why her letter of June 3rd from the Housing Authority was not included on this agenda under correspondence. When she was on the Board, any letter that was received was placed on the Agenda.
- Mr. Jess stated that not every letter received goes on the agenda and because negotiations are ongoing the letter was not posted.
- Public member #7 - stated that when people speak in public they need to give their name and address because it's required. If they refuse then they shouldn't be recognized by the Chair and if questions are asked they don't have to be answered. You need to be more assertive when people come to the microphone and speak. With regards to the new Superintendent, his compensation is nothing compared to what people get who work a 35 hour week in government. Superintendents work 70 to 90 hours a week so the salary is warranted.
- Mr. Lebreault stated the salary was determined based upon the salaries of superintendent's in similar sized districts. We had to get State approval for this salary. If the district has over 10,000 students the salary can be higher. Mr. Lebreault took the average of all districts that are similar and it came to \$200,000. He then removed the highest and the lowest salary and averaged them, and it came to \$200,000. He then used the enrollment in similar sized districts and did a projection and it came up to \$200,000. Dr. Roman also came to the same amount.

He has made a huge impact on the students. He started the Debate Team; he's an excellent teacher and while I'm happy for him, I'm sad for us. He's a great role model as well. He hopes everyone remembers his service and those people that he's touched.

In March 2014, the Department issued an evaluation of the Perth Amboy School District pursuant to the requirements of the Quality Single Accountability Continuum (QSAC), N.J.A.C. 6A:30 et seq. At that time, the district was placed on a continuum in each of the areas evaluated in the district performance review (DPR): instruction and program, fiscal management, operations, personnel and governance.

Following that initial evaluation, the district developed improvement plans to address noncompliant areas in instruction and program and governance; the plans were approved in May and September 2014. Staff from the Middlesex County Office of Education conducted an interim review of the district's progress in the areas of instruction and program and governance. Listed below are the initial placement and interim review placement scores for your district:

I also have worked on the ELL Scaffold of the NJDOE Math and ELA Model Curriculum. I have written model units based on the model curriculum for the NJDOE. I have been on the executive board of NJTESOL/NJBE since May 2007. I am currently serving as secretary. I have presented at NJTESOL/NJBE spring conferences as well as the 2009 NJEA Convention.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS - YEAR ONE (I)

HS-A 001 AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY 1

This course has been developed to provide the student with a formal introduction to the automotive industry. Students will be presented with an overview of the various job opportunities available in the automotive industry. A general overview and understanding of the various automotive systems as well as industry certifications will be discussed. Emphasis and assessment of life skills and cognitive skills will help to ensure the students success throughout this course and the remainder of the automotive training program.

Students will learn how to interpret written reference material to include textbook, service manuals, dictionaries, and etc.; properly communicate in the workplace; properly use safety equipment, clothing, and materials; properly select the correct hand, power, and diagnostic tools for the task; and properly use measurement tools such as rulers, dial indicators, micrometer, and calipers.

HS-A 002 AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY 2

This course is designed to provide the student with a detailed study of the modern internal combustion gasoline engine from the basic principles of design and operation to inspection, precision measurement, fitting, and reconditioning, including cooling systems, coolants, lubricating systems, and engine lubricants.

Students will learn how to complete repair orders containing customer and vehicle information and corrective action. Students will learn how to research vehicle service information through the use of printed service manuals, online and computer based electronic retrieval systems.

Students will learn how to diagnose various engine concerns through visual and auditory inspection. Students will learn how to disassemble, measure, troubleshoot, service, and reassemble a gasoline powered internal combustion engine.

HS-A 003 AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY 3

This course is designed to provide the student with practical theory in basic and solid state circuitry, including body electrical systems, operation and service of automotive storage batteries, automobile charging systems, starting systems, and lighting systems. Students will evaluate components using both conventional and electronic diagnostic equipment.

Students will learn how to complete repair orders containing customer and vehicle information and corrective action. Students will learn how to research vehicle service information through the use of printed service manuals, online and computer based electronic retrieval systems. Students will learn how to diagnose basic electrical, charging, starting, and lighting circuits through the use of diagnostic equipment to include test lights, multimeters, and continuity testers.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS - YEAR TWO (2)

HS-A 010 AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY 4

This course is designed to provide the student with theory and application of automobile air conditioning and heating systems. Students will also be presented with the operation of various automobile accessories to include: power windows, door locks, and seats, and air bag operation and service.

Students will learn how to complete repair orders containing customer and vehicle information and corrective action. Students will learn how to research vehicle service information through the use of printed service manuals, online and computer based electronic retrieval systems. Students will learn how to diagnose abnormal operation of air conditioning and heating systems, remove and replace air conditioning and heating system components, and evacuate and recharge automobile air conditioning systems.

HS-A 020 AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY 5

This course is designed to provide comprehensive coverage of design, operating principles, maintenance and service of the automotive brake systems and traction control. Emphasis is placed on diagnosis and service of rotors and drums with measuring and resurfacing included. Anti-lock braking is covered from operating principles through diagnosis and service.

Students will learn how to complete repair orders containing customer and vehicle information and corrective action. Students will learn how to research vehicle service information through the use of printed service manuals, online and computer based electronic retrieval systems. Students will learn how to diagnose mechanical and hydraulic problems within the vehicle braking systems. Students will learn how to diagnose computer control problems within the anti-lock and traction control systems.

HS-A 030 AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY 6

This course is designed to provide the student with detailed instruction of the design and operating principles, maintenance and service of automobile suspension and steering systems including steering geometry and alignment angles. Emphasis is placed on wheel alignment procedures, including computerized four-wheel alignment. Service and diagnostics are stressed including McPherson struts, rack and pinion steering systems, and tire design and applications. New technologies are covered to incorporate four wheel steering, electronic steering, and in-depth coverage of computerized suspension systems.

Students will learn how to complete repair orders containing customer and vehicle information and corrective action. Students will learn how to research vehicle service information through the use of printed service manuals, online and computer based electronic retrieval systems. Students will learn how to diagnose, inspect, and service steering system components using industry standard equipment. Students will learn how to diagnose inspect, remove and replace rear-wheel and front-wheel drive suspension component. Students will learn how to perform alignments on front and rear wheel drive vehicles.

Nature and Scope of Job:

The School Security Personnel promotes attitudes of student responsibility and assists the professional staff with the safety of students and staff and the security of the facilities.

Duties and Responsibilities:

School Security Personnel shall:

- Sufficient mobility to patrol and monitor hallways, stairwells, toilet facilities, outside facilities, and other public and unsupervised places of the school to ensure the safety and well-being of students, staff and the security of the facility.
- Ensure a smooth traffic flow of students through the hallways, assisting students with on-time arrival to class and to assigned locations.
- Monitor and assist students upon entering and leaving the school.
- Assist with supervision in the breakfast and lunch periods and with morning arrival and afternoon dismissal of students.
- Remove disruptive students from classes when needed.

- Assist school administrators with applying the school security plan and with other security-related matters.
- Assist the professional staff, police, and emergency personnel in handling emergencies or disruptive situations.
- Encourage and ensure that students wear identification badges.
- Assist visitors with directions and secure proper identification.
- Prevent unauthorized visitors from entering building and take appropriate action to remove them from school premises.
- Report any discipline infractions, unauthorized visitors, and acts of vandalism to the Principal.
- Notify the building administration, police, and/or appropriate emergency personnel of any emergency, potentially dangerous, or unusual situations.
